Stationery Requirements for 2020

These following items are required every day at school by all children:

Textas (optional – only used occasionally to outline)

School Uniform

We believe that it is important that children learn to present themselves well and take pride in their appearance. We also expect each child to wear the correct school uniform. Things to consider over the Christmas period:

- Children are expected to wear the correct uniform at all times.
- **Black** school shoes are to be worn daily
- Hairstyles and accessories should be conservative. e.g. no rat tails, no hair colouring or streaks, and no radical haircut styles (severely shaved undercut, shaved lines in hair).
- Long hair needs to be tied back.
- Hair ribbons or scrunchies must match the colours of the uniform.
- No earrings are to be worn except for sleepers or studs (must be in both ears).
- No other jewellery is to be worn.
- Sports uniform is worn on sport days.

Thank you for assisting the school in maintaining a high standard of dress.
